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Parts of Speech

English grammar is built from different categories of words called parts of speech. The eight main parts are noun, pronoun, verb, adjective, adverb, preposition, conjunction, and interjection. Understanding these categories helps you form correct sentences.

Examples

- The dog runs fast.
- She sings beautifully.
- They bought a new car.
- He quickly finished the task.
- The teacher explained the lesson.

Exercises

- Identify the noun: The cat sleeps on the sofa.
- Identify the verb: She writes every day.
- Identify the adjective: It is a beautiful garden.
- Identify the adverb: He runs quickly.
- Write your own sentence using a noun and verb.



Nouns

A noun is a word that names a person, place, thing, or idea. Types include common nouns, proper nouns, abstract nouns, and collective nouns.

Examples

- The teacher explained the lesson.
- Paris is a beautiful city.
- Honesty is important.
- The team won the match.
- My brother bought a laptop.

Pronouns

Pronouns replace nouns so sentences are not repetitive.

Examples

- Sarah is tired. She worked all day.
- Tom and Anna arrived. They are happy.
- I enjoy learning English.
- We are studying grammar.
- It is raining outside.

- Replace the noun with a pronoun: John is my friend.
- Write a sentence using 'they'.
- Identify the pronoun: We love English.
- Replace the noun: Maria is late.

Verbs

Verbs show action or a state of being.

Examples

- She runs every morning.
- They play football.
- I believe you.
- He eats breakfast early.
- We study English daily.

- Identify the verb: She enjoys music.
- Write a sentence with 'study'.
- Correct the sentence: He go to school.



Adjectives

Adjectives describe nouns and give more information about them.

Examples

- A beautiful garden
- A tall building
- A delicious meal
- A smart student
- A cold day

- Describe a city using adjectives.

Adverbs

Adverbs modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs.

Examples

- He runs quickly.
- She speaks clearly.
- They worked hard.
- The baby slept peacefully.
- He answered correctly.

- Write a sentence using 'quickly'.
- Change to adverb: He is careful.
- Fill: She drives ____ (slow).
- Write a sentence with an adverb.



Prepositions

Prepositions show relationships between words in a sentence.

Examples

- The book is on the table.
- The cat is under the chair.
- They walked through the park.
- The keys are in the bag.
- She sat beside him.

- Identify the preposition: He walked into the room.
- Fill: The keys are ___ my pocket.

Conjunctions

Conjunctions connect words, phrases, or clauses.

Examples

- I like tea and coffee.
- I wanted to go, but it rained.
- She stayed home because she was sick.
- You can call me or send a message.
- He was tired, yet he continued working.

- Identify the conjunction: She tried but failed.

Present Simple

The present simple tense describes habits and general truths.

Examples

- She works every day.
- They live in Canada.
- He drinks coffee every morning.
- We study English online.
- The sun rises in the east.

- Fill: He ____ (play) football.
- Create a sentence using 'live'.



Past Simple

The past simple describes actions that happened in the past.

Examples

- I visited Paris last year.
- They watched a movie yesterday.
- She finished her homework.
- We traveled to Spain.
- He bought a new phone.

- Write three past actions.
- Fill: She ____ (finish) the work.

Future Tense

Future tense describes actions that will happen.

Examples

- I will travel tomorrow.
- She will call you later.
- They will start the meeting soon.
- We will study tonight.
- He will visit his parents.
